My dear Darwin,

I want to send you
a line to say that nothing
will be done in Nature without
your full approval. Sowler
left the Editorial department in
my charge when he went away,
& so I did not go on with
the scheme of publishing extracts
from the letters till you should

be consulted. The scheme was not
mine, & I think your objections
to it most wise & right.

My idea is to have a
series of 4 or 5 articles treating
only of his life & work so far
as these may be gathered from
material already published. I
had a talk with Macmillan
yesterday, & arranged that there
should be no re-publication of
these articles in a separate

form, as this might look
too much like trying to
make capital out of the
interest taken by the public.

He wants to have a photo-
graph of the Library, but I
cannot say I much like this
idea either. In justice, however,

I must say that he is very
considerate, & relies on me not
to do anything, of which the
family would disapprove.

There is another matter I
should like to ask you about
before it goes further. Some

members of the L.S. Council
have mooted the project of issuing
the two last papers in a separate
form with an engraving of the
portrait. As you may not
yourself attend the next Council
meeting, I should like to
hear what you feel about this.
