More Letters of Charles Darwin, edited by *Francis Darwin and A. C. Seward*. In two volumes. "A record of his work in a series of hitherto unpublished letters." The correspondence with Sir Joseph Hooker is especially noteworthy, for Darwin wrote to him with complete freedom. But the correspondence with Sir Charles Lyell, Felix Müller, Huxley, and Mr. A. R. Wallace is hardly inferior in biographical interest. The volumes have been prepared to give as full an idea as possible of the course of Darwin's work. Fourteen portraits. (Murray. 9 x 6.
