Desmodium -

Some of the brown is only in the epidermis
 but in many places the chlorophyll
 is ~~almost~~ destroyed in the cells
 under the epidermis, & in one or two
 places the injury extends through to
 the under side. In ^{most} ~~few~~ sections
 the ^{vascular bundles} ~~veins~~ are clearly browned.
