"More Letters of Charles Darwin." Edited by Francis Darwin and R. C. Seward. Two vols. Pp. 434 and 208. 3s. net.

Some of these letters have been received since the life and letters were published in 1887, to among others Huxley, Lyell, Mr. John Morley. Most of them, however, are those omitted from the first collection owing to want of space. These include a lengthy correspondence with Sir Joseph Hooker. They form an almost complete second biography, which has been rendered continuous by excerpts from the former volumes. A large mass of these are purely technical discussions. Every biologist will have to read them. Illustrated by good portraits of Darwin and his friends.
