The West, East, and North Galleries will be reserved for Ladies who receive tickets.

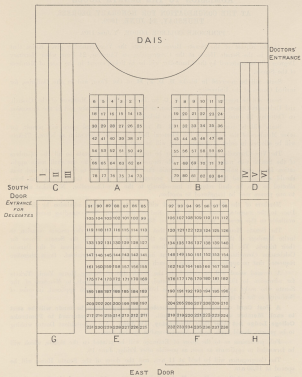
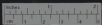
A limited space will be reserved in the corners of the East Gallery for Bachelors and Undergraduates who receive invitations.

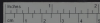

At the request of the Senate House Syndicate the Vice-Chancellor gives notice that admission to the Senate House at the Congregation on Thursday, 24 June, when Honorary Degrees will be conferred by the Chancellor, will be by ticket, except in the case of Members of the Senate.

Seats will be reserved in blocks **B, D, F, H** of the Floor, and in the Galleries, for invited Guests of the University.

Seats will be reserved in blocks **A, C**, for Doctors, Professors, Members of the Council, and University Officers who make application as below. They will take part in the Procession on Thursday, 24 June, and will not require tickets.

Seats will be reserved in blocks **E, G**, as far as the limited space will permit, for other Members of the Senate on the Electoral Roll who make application as below. Tickets will be allotted in order of Seniority, and will be sent by post.

The Vice-Chancellor fears that it may be impossible to allot seats to all the Members of the Senate who make application. 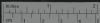

Full particulars as to the doors of Entrance will be printed on the tickets, which will be forwarded to applicants as soon as possible after Friday, June 18.

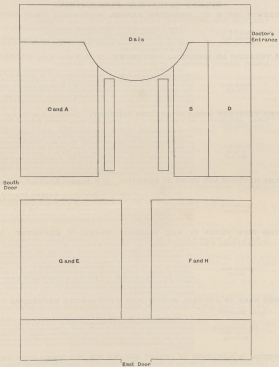
The Congregation will be held at 11 a.m. and the doors of the Senate House will be opened at 10.30 a.m.
