



## Darwin

A comprehensive collection of Charles Darwin's published and unpublished writings, excluding correspondence, will be available on the internet.



Professor James Secord from the
Department of History and Philosophy of
Science and Professor Janet Browne from
the Wellcome Trust Centre for the History
of Medicine, University College London,
have been awarded a major three-year
grant by the Arts and Humanities Research
Council to create the collection. The
project, designed and directed by Dr John
van Wyhe, aims to make available online
every book, article and significant
unpublished manuscript by Darwin,
including associated contemporary book
reviews and related sources.

"The site will be of invaluable use to

students and scholars in the fields of history, history of science, literature, philosophy and the natural sciences and lay readers throughout the world," said Dr van Wyhe. The project is complementary to the

existing Darwin Correspondence Project at the University Library and is based at The Centre for Research in the Arts, Social Sciences and Humanities (CRASSH) at the University of Cambridge.
